## Gooseberry Fool

## Materials:

3 balls of bulky (chunky) merino/baby alpaca yarn $-2 \times$ dark grey (A), $1 \times$ green (B); $100 \mathrm{~g} / 77 \mathrm{yd} / 70 \mathrm{~m}$

## Needles:

10 mm (US 15, UK 000) knitting needles

## Size:

Circumference: 51 in $(130 \mathrm{~cm})$, height: $10 \mathrm{in}(25 \mathrm{~cm})$

## Tension:

8 sts $\times 14$ rows $=4$ in $(10 \mathrm{~cm})$ square using 10 mm (US 15, UK 000) needles

## Instructions:

Using yarn A, cast on 21 sts.
Foundation row: knit each st tbl to form a neat edge.
Rows 1-6: using yarn A, k1, *yo, k2tog, rep from * to end.
Rows 7-10: using yarn B, knit.
Repeat these 10 rows until work measures approximately $511 / 4 i n(130 \mathrm{~cm})$ ending with row 10.
Cast off, leaving a long yarn tail for sewing up your work.

## Making up

Press snood lightly. Join cast-on and cast-off ends using mattress stitch with RS facing. Weave in all loose ends.


This is a great quick knit and a very simple pattern that an almost novice knitter could make. I have used a bulky (chunky) lightweight yarn that drapes beautifully.

## Purple Mist

## Materials:

1 ball of light worsted (DK/8-ply) merino yarn in variegated purple/lilac; 100g/251yd/230m

## Needles:

5.5mm (US 9, UK 5) knitting needles

## Instructions:

Cast on 41 sts.
Foundation row: knit all sts tbl to form a neat edge.
Row 1: k3, p2, * k1, p1, k1, p4, repeat from * to the last 8 sts, k1, p1, k1, p2, k3.
Row 2: k3, k2, * p1, k1, p1, k4, repeat from * to the last 8 sts, p1, k1, p1, k5.
Row 3: k3, p2, * kfbf, p1, kfbf, p4, rep from * to the last 8 sts, kfbf, p1, kfbf, p2, k3.
Row 4: k3, k2, *p2tog, k1, p2tog, k4, rep from * to the last 8 sts, p2tog, k1, p2tog, k5.

Repeat rows 1-4 until work measures approximately $24 \mathrm{in}(61 \mathrm{~cm})$.
Cast off, leaving a long yarn tail for sewing up your work.

## Size:

Circumference: 24in ( 61 cm ), height: $81 / 4 \mathrm{in}(21 \mathrm{~cm})$

## Tension:

19 sts $\times 24$ rows $=4$ in $(10 \mathrm{~cm})$ square using
5.5 mm (US 9, UK 5) needles

## Making up

Press snood lightly. Join cast-on and cast-off ends using mattress stitch with RS facing. Weave in all loose ends.


This is a very simple little textured snood that only uses one ball of a lovely variegated yarn.
