#### Right front

With yarn E, case n 18 sts.

Rows 1-3: k to ...d.

Row 4 (WS): p to last 3 sts, k3.

Row 5: k to end.

Rows 6-31: repeat rows 4 and 5, 13 more times.

Row 32: as row 4.

**Row 33:** k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1 (17 sts). Place a marking thread at the end of the row.

Row 34: p1, p2tog, p to last 3 sts, k3 (16 sts).

Row 35: k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1 (15 sts).

Row 36: p to last 3 sts, k3.

Row 37: k to end.

Rows 38 and 39: repeat rows 36 and 37.

Row 40: as row 36.

Break yarn and place the first 10 sts on holder.

#### Right shoulder

**Row 41:** with RS facing, re-join yarn to remaining sts and k to end (5 sts).

Row 42: p to end.

Cast off.

#### Left front

Work as for right front to row 3 (18 sts).

Row 4 (WS): k3, p to end.

Row 5: k to end.

Rows 6-31: repeat rows 4 and 5, thirteen more times.

Row 32: as row 4.

**Row 33:** k1, k2tog, k to end (17 sts). Place a marking thread at the beginning of the row.

Row 34: k3, p to last 3 sts, p2tog, p1 (16 sts).

Row 35: as row 33.

Row 36: k3, p to end.

Row 37: k to end.

Rows 38 and 39: repeat rows 36 and 37.

Row 40: as row 36.

#### Left shoulder

**Row 41:** k5, turn. Place remaining sts on holder. Work on this set of 5 sts.

**Row 42:** p5.

Cast off.



#### Collar

The collar is worked in reversible knitting so will appear as st st on both sides.

Join front and back pieces at the shoulders.

With yarn E, k10 sts from the right front holder, pick up 6 sts from the neck edge, k14 from the centre back holder, pick up 6 sts from the neck edge, k10 from the left front holder, turn (46 sts). Join yarn F and start working with yarn E and F held together.

Row 1 (WS): p2, (p2tog, p2) to end (35 sts).

Start working reversible knitting as follows.

 $\textbf{Row 2:} \ (k1E, both \ yarns \ forward, p1F, both \ yarns \ back) \ to \ end.$ 

**Row 3:** (p1E, both yarns back, k1F, both yarns forward) to end.

Rows 4 and 5: repeat rows 2 and 3.

Row 6: as row 2.

Row 7: hold yarn E in front and knit yarn E sts. At the same time, using another needle, cast off yarn F at the back of yarn E sts.

Now you have separated two layers and have yarn E sts only on the needle.

 $\textbf{Rows 8 and 9:} \ starting \ with a \ p \ row, \ work \ 2 \ rows \ in \ st \ st.$ 

Cast off.

#### Sleeve (make two)

With yarn E, cast on 18 sts.

**Rows 1–22:** starting with a k (RS) row, work 22 rows in st st.

**Row 23:** k1, skpo, k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1 (16 sts). Leave marking threads at the beginning and end.

Row 24: p to end.

Rows 25-28: repeat rows 23 and 24 (12 sts).

Cast off.

#### Left pocket

With yarn E, cast on 12 sts.

Rows 1–7: starting with a p (WS) row, work 7 rows in st st.

Row 8: cast off 3 sts, k to end (9 sts).

Row 9: p6, p2tog, p1 (8 sts).

Row 10: k1, skpo, k to end (7 sts).

**Rows 11–13:** starting with a p row, work 3 rows in st st.

Cast off.

#### Right pocket

Work as for the left pocket to row 6.

Row 7: cast off 3 sts, p to end (9 sts).

Row 8: k6, k2tog, k1 (8 sts).

Row 9: p1, p2tog, p to end (7 sts).


Rows 10-13: starting with a k row, work 4 rows in st st.

Cast off.











#### Head

Start from the top of head and finish at the chin.

With yarn B and 2.75mm (UK 12, US 2) needles, cast on 12 sts.

Row 1 (WS): p to end.

Row 2: (k1, kfb) three times, (kfb, k1) three times (18 sts).

Row 3: p to end.

Row 4: (k2, kfb) three times, (kfb, k2) three times (24 sts).

Rows 5-15: starting with a p row, work 11 rows in st st.

**Row 16:** (k2, k2tog) five times, k1, k2tog, k1 (18 sts).

**Row 17:** p to end.

Row 18: (k1, k2tog) five times, k2tog, k1 (12 sts).

Break yarn, thread through sts, draw up tightly, and fasten off.

#### Ear (make two)

With yarn B and 2.75mm (UK 12, US 2) needles, cast on 3 sts.

Row 1 (WS): pfb, p1, pfb (5 sts).

Rows 2-7: starting with a k row, work 6 rows in st st.

Row 8: skpo, k1, k2tog (3 sts).

Row 9: sl1, p2tog (2 sts).

Pass the first st over the second and fasten off.

#### Eye (make two)

Work as for Shaun the Sheep (see page 24).





#### Arm (make two)

With yarn B and 2.75mm (UK 12, US 2) needles, cast on 8 sts.

Row 1 (WS): (pfb) in each st to end (16 sts).

Rows 2–5: starting with a k row, work 4 rows in st st.


Row 6: k4, (k2tog) four times, k4 (12 sts).

Rows 7-13: starting with a p row, work 7 rows in st st.

Row 14: k1, k2tog, k to end (11 sts).

Rows 15–24: starting with a p row, work 10 rows in st st. Cast off.

The seam will be on the palm side. Insert the wire if desired.



#### Hooves

Fold the arm in han rengthwise and work a gathering thread along the cast-on edge, pulling it tight. Sew the seam up to the cast-off edge and stuff the arm. Use yarn B to pierce the hand (cast-on end) just as you did for Shaun's hoof to shape it.

Attach the cast-off end of the arm to the body.

#### Hands

For Timmy's Mum, or any of the standing sheep, you can make the hooves look more like hands: follow the instructions below. Note that the seam will be on the palm side. Sew edges to differentiate the fingers.

Insert wire if desired.

# Making hands for hooves



This is how the hand piece will look when knitted.




Fold the hand in half horizontally and sew the first and second cast-off edges together.

#### Hooves or hands?

Much like Shaun, Timmy's Mum has hooves, but if you would like her to have hands like The Twins (see page 106) you can follow the pattern for Arms on page 108 instead, and make them up as below.

3.75mm (UK 9, US 5) knitting needles 2.75mm (UK 12, US 2) knitting needles Stitch holder

Chenille needle

#### Other supplies

4 × cotton buds (cotton swabs) (optional) Toy stuffing

#### Finished size

16cm (61/4in) tall plus ears: 14cm (51/2in) long

#### Body

With yarn A and 3.75mm (UK 9, US 5) knitting needles, cast on 12 sts.

Row 1 (RS): k to end.

Row 2: (k1, kfb) three times, (kfb, k1) three times (18 sts).

Row 3: k to end.

Row 4: (k2, kfb) three times, (kfb, k2) three times (24 sts).

Row 5: k to end.

Row 6: (k3, kfb) three times, (kfb, k3) three times (30 sts).

Rows 7-20: k to end.

#### Right front

Row 21: k12 and turn, work on these sts only, placing remaining sts on holder (12 sts).

Rows 22-27: k to end.

Place a marking thread at the end of row 27. Cast off.

  I used Rowan Soft Bouclé in Snow (600),
  50g/1%oz/100m/109yd

   25g (%oz) of DK (8-ply/light worsted) yarn in black (B) –
  I used Rowan Alpaca Soft DK in Simply Black (216),
  50g/1%oz/125m/137yd

   Small amount of any 4-ply (fingering) yarn in white (C)

  Tools

  3.75mm (UK 9, US 5) knitting needles

  2.75mm (UK 12, US 2) knitting needles

  Finished size
  Both: 16cm (61/4in) tall

## Instructions

#### Body (make two)

Both bodies are made in a similar way - add more toy stuffing to the larger Twin to differentiate him.

Work as for Timmy's Mum (see page 73) to row 16 (30 sts).

Rows 17-23: k to end.

Row 24: (k3, k2tog) five times, k2, k2tog, k1 (24 sts).

Rows 25-29: k to end.

Row 30: (k2, k2tog) five times, k1, k2tog, k1. 18 sts).

Rows 31-32: k to end.

Row 33: (k1, k2tog) five times, k2tog, k1 (12 sts).

Cast off.



#### Arm (make four)

With yarn B and 2.75mm needles, cast on 7 sts.

Row 1: p to end

**Row 2:** k2. Work on this set of 2 sts on the RH needle. Leave remaining sts on the LH needle. Turn.

Rows 3-8: starting with a p row, work in st st.

**Row 2:** k3 from the LH needle and work on this set of 3 sts. Leave remaining sts on the LH needle.

Rows 3-8: starting with a p row, work in st st.

Row 2: k2 from the LH needle and work on this set of 2 sts

Rows 3-8: starting with a p row, work in st st.

Row 9: cast on 4 sts, p to end (11 sts).

Rows 10–26: starting with a k row, work 17 rows in st st. Cast off.

Make up the hands following the instructions on page 75.

## Leg (make four)

Work as for Timmy's Mum (see page 76).

#### Tail (make two)

Work as for Shaun the Sheep (see page 26).

#### Mouth (make two)

Work as for Timmy's Mum (see page 76).

#### The thinner Twin

#### Head

With yarn B and 2.75mm (UK 12, US 2) needles, cast on 12 sts.

Row 1 (WS): p to end.

Row 2: (k1, kfb) three times, (kfb, k1) three times (18 sts).

Row 3: p to end.

Row 4: (k2, kfb) three times, (kfb, k2) twice, k to end (23 sts).

Rows 5–12: starting with a p row, work 8 rows in st st.

Row 13: (k2, k2tog) five times, k3 (18 sts).

Row 14: p to end.

Row 15: (k1, k2tog) five times, k2tog, k1 (12 sts).

Break yarn, thread through sts, draw up tightly, and fasten off.

#### Ear (make two)

Work as for Timmy's Mum (see page 74) to row 7 (5 sts).

Row 8: k to end.

Row 9: p2tog, p1, p2tog (3 sts).

Row 10: sl1, k2tog (2 sts).

Pass the first st over the second and fasten off.

#### The larger Twin

#### Head

With yarn B and 2.75mm (UK 12, US 2) needles, cast on 10 sts.

Row 1 (WS): p to end.

Row 2: (kfb) to end (20 sts).

Row 3: p to end.
