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Instructions

EARS



1 Take one 3.5m (4yd) string (this will be your guide string), fold it in half and pin it on the board.



2 Tie on five more strings with reversed lark's head knots.



3 Take the end of the guide string at the top, fold it down and tie a line of double half hitch knots using all the strings except the last two.



4 Take the first string on the left, use it as a guide and tie all the strings from the previous line of double half hitch knots, to make a new line, as shown above.

5 Continue making new lines of double half hitch knots, always using the first string on the left as the guide for every new line. You will have one less string to use for the double half hitch knots.



6 Continue until you have one last double half hitch knot.

PART 4 – FRINGES

Note: please read through the steps below before cutting the strings for your fringes as you might want to add more or fewer strings and have longer or shorter fringes than mine.

For the part 1 fringes I used:

Eight 90cm (35½in) strings in mustard; six 90cm (35½in) strings in natural.

For the part 3 fringes I used:

Twenty-two 70cm (27½in) strings in natural; five 70cm (27½in) strings in mustard.



1 Tie the strings on the lead string, with a lark's head knot, alternating the colours. Place five strings on each side.



2 Starting from the top of the band, tie a white string with a lark's head knot on the outer string.

3 Next, on the outer strings in between the diamond, tie a white, mustard and a white string.

4 Repeat **step 3** with all the gaps between the diamonds.
