


3 Take one of the pieces of fabric to make the back, and cut in half lengthways. Re-sew these two pieces together with a ¼in (0.5cm) seam allowance. Press the seam open.



4 Place the template centrally over the seam, trace the outline and cut round it.



5 Cut the heart shape from the front fabric using the template.

6 With right sides together, pin then sew all the way round the heart. Snip into the curves. Using the seam ripper, undo about 2in (5cm) of stitches from the back seam.

Turn the heart the right way out. Stuff with the toy stuffing, adding the dried lavender as you go. Close the opening with a ladder stitch (see page 13).

 $8\,$ Hand sew the ribbon to the top of the heart and cover your stitches with the buttons.

Typ If you prefer a fuller shape of heart, make your template with a 5in (12.7cm) depth in the centre instead of 9in (22.8cm).

Pumpkin Pillow

The texture and dimension of this pumpkin pillow give it centre stage in my blue-themed bedroom! Use it among other pillows to dress the bed or, with a little less stuffing, it would make for a very comfortable seat pad.

What you need:

Round pillow pad with a diameter of 8in (20.5cm)

One piece of fabric measuring 13in (33cm) square A contrasting fabric measuring

the same

A loop turner and strong thread

Embroidery needle and thread Two buttons, one large and one small

A 12in (30.5cm) dinner plate as a template

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Bottle Bag

This makes perfectly presented wine for the picnic table, or a stylish gift bag for a bottle of wine. The little pocket on the side is a handy place to keep the cork. Cheers!



What you need:

For the outside of the bag, fabric measuring 9 x 12in (22.8 x 30.5cm) Contrasting fabric measuring 12 x $3\frac{1}{2}$ in (30.5 x 9cm) For the lining, fabric measuring 12 x 12in (30.5 x 30.5cm) For the pocket, fabric measuring 4in (10cm) square 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ in (29.2cm) of $\frac{3}{4}$ in (19mm) bias binding or silbap for the

or ribbon for the drawstring tape 24in (61cm) of string to tie Safety pin

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Air erasable pen



Sew the contrasting fabric right sides together to the top of the outer fabric.

2 Draw a line 1½ in (3.8cm) from the top with air erasable pen. This is where you will sew the tape that will act as a channel for the drawstring.

Garment Protector

Keep your garments dust-free and beautifully presented. If you are giving a gift of clothing, this protector is the perfect finishing touch.

What you need:

A coat hanger Two 20 x 7in (51 x 18cm) pieces of patterned fabric Two 20 x 3in (51 x 7.5cm) strips of plain fabric

Lace measuring 39in (99cm) Ribbon measuring 12in (30.5cm) and button for the bow



Place the two 20 x 7in (51 x 18cm) patterned pieces right sides together, pinning if necessary.

2 Place the coat hanger 2in (5cm) from the top (not including the hook). Draw an arc 1in (2.5cm) from the top of the hanger, using the hanger as your template. Extend the arc by 2in (5cm) on each side. Mark the position of the hook.
